



Apportionments, also known as Connectional Missional Giving

Through Connectional Missional Giving, each United Methodist Church is asked to give a portion of their church revenue to "The Administration" if you will, of The United Methodist Church which will then determine where the greatest needs are and how all United Methodist churches can participate in being the hands and feet of Jesus. Throughout the year there are opportunities to help cover the cost of the apportionments. One of those ways will be the Altar Rail Giving on Communion Sunday on the 3rd Sunday of the month. This year's Fall Festival proceeds will go towards our Connectional Missional Giving as well. Apportionments, our connectional/missional giving, help fund local and annual conference ministries, global ministries, structure and leadership. The General Funds include the World Service Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, Episcopal Fund, Black College Fund, Interdenominational Cooperation Fund, Africa University Fund, and the General Administration Fund. Together, through our connected congregations, we accomplish what no single church, district or annual conference ever could hope to do alone. In this way, each individual, each family, each congregation gives a fair share for the church's work. We combine our prayers, presence, gifts and service to make a significant difference in the lives of God's people.
